To Our Valued Seattle Patrons,

The Boards of Trustees of both the King County Library System and the Seattle Public Library approved an extension of the existing reciprocal borrowing agreement through December 31, 2012 between the two library systems.

Under this agreement, KCLS and SPL patrons continue to have full access to both systems including physical and virtual use of all libraries, information services, programming, and materials on the shelves.

Patrons who live within the Seattle city limits still may not place holds, a limit in place since October 1, 2006. This limit was imposed to relieve KCLS taxpayers of the cost of transporting "hold" materials for Seattle residents, an activity that contributed significantly to the economic imbalance discovered in a cross-use study of the King County Library System and the Seattle Public Library. When cross-use was re-examined in 2008, this limitation had corrected this imbalance resulting in fairly even cross-use for taxpayers of both library systems.

We regret any inconvenience this limit causes. KCLS looks forward to continuing our long history of cooperation and commitment to excellent library service to all residents of King County, regardless of jurisdictional boundaries.
