 This is the first book in the beloved series about growing up on the Wisconsin frontier. 237 pages

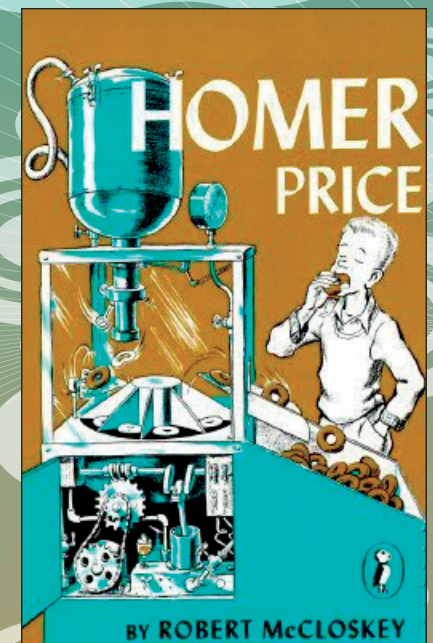
Wyss, Johann J/Y
