Coyote: a Trickster Tale from the American Southwest
 Coyote, who has a nose for trouble, insists that the blackbirds teach him how to fly, but the experience ends in disaster for him.
- McVitty, W. J398.20953
Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves
 A poor woodcutter discovers the hidden treasures of a band of robbers, survives great danger, and brings riches to his whole family. This story from the Arabian Nights is illustrated in the style of Persian miniatures.
- Newton, P. J398.20954
The Stonecutter: an Indian Folktale
 A retelling of a traditional Indian tale in which a discontented stonecutter is never satisfied with each wish that is granted him.
- Ransome, A. J398.21
The Fool of the World and the Flying Ship: a Russian Tale
 When the Czar proclaims that he will marry his daughter to the man who brings him a flying ship, the Fool of the World sets out to try his luck and meets some unusual companions on the way.

 Retells the tale of twelve princesses who dance secretly all night long and how their secret is eventually discovered.

- Aardema, V. J398.20972
Borreguita and the Coyote: a Tale from Ayutla, Mexico
 A little lamb uses her clever wiles to keep a coyote from eating her up.
- Aesop J398.2452
Aesop's Fables
 This version combines 23 of Aesop's timeless morality tales with striking black ink illustrations by revered artist Jacob Lawrence.
- Ata, T. J398.2089
Baby Rattlesnake
 Willful Baby Rattlesnake throws tantrums to get his rattle before he's ready, but he misuses it and learns a lesson.
- Climo, S. J398.2
The Korean Cinderella
 In this version of Cinderella set in ancient Korea, Pear Blossom, a stepchild, eventually comes to be chosen by the magistrate to be his wife.
- Coburn, J. J398.22
Jouanah, a Hmong Cinderella
 Despite a cruel stepmother's schemes, Jouanah, a young Hmong girl, finds true love and happiness with the aid of her dead mother's spirit and a pair of special sandals.
- Courlander, H. J398.2096
The Cow-Tail Switch and Other West African Stories
 A collection of West African folk tales about men and animals, kings, warriors, and farmers.
- Czernecki, S. J398.24
The Singing Snake
 A retelling of the Australian aboriginal tale about a snake that swallows a lark in an effort to win a singing contest.

Sody Salleratus
 A seemingly simple trip to the store for a box of sody salleratus (baking soda) turns into a disappearing act for a boy, a girl, an old man and an old woman in this humorous retelling of a traditional Appalachian folktale.

Adelita: A Mexican Cinderella Story
 After the death of her parents, Adelita is badly mistreated by her stepmother and stepsisters until she finds her true love at a grand fiesta.

Fin M'Coul: the Giant of Knockmany Hill
 Fin M'Coul's wife, Oonagh, helps him outwit his arch rival, Cucullin.
- DeFelice, C. J398.20973
Dancing Skeleton
 An ornery dead man refuses to stay in his coffin and causes a disturbance when the best fiddler in town comes to call on his widow.
- Demi J398.20951
The Empty Pot
 When Ping admits that he is the only child in China unable to grow a flower from the seeds distributed by the Emperor, he is rewarded for his honesty.
- Forest, H. J398.208992
A Big, Quiet House: a Yiddish Folktale from Eastern Europe
 Unable to stand his overcrowded and noisy home any longer, a man goes to the wise old woman who lives nearby for advice.

Children of the Dragon: Selected Tales from Vietnam
 An illustrated collection of Vietnamese folktales with explanatory notes following each story.

Saint George and the Dragon: a Golden Legend
 Retells the segment from Spenser's The Faerie Queene, in which George, the Red Cross Knight, slays the dreadful dragon that has been terrorizing the countryside for years and brings peace and joy to the land.

Two of Everything: a Chinese Folktale
 A poor old Chinese farmer finds a magic brass pot that doubles whatever is placed inside it, but his efforts to make himself wealthy lead to unexpected complications.

Yoshi's Feast
 When Yoshi's neighbor, Sabu, the eel broiler, attempts to charge him for the delicious smelling aromas he has been enjoying, Yoshi hatches a plan to enrich them both.
- Lang, A. J398
The Blue Fairy Book
 Between 1899 and 1907, Andrew Lang collected scores of fairy tales from around the world and published them in this "colored" 12 volume series. The Blue book includes such favorites as Story of Pretty Goldilocks, Aladdin, Toads and Diamonds, and Prince Darling.

Further Tales of Uncle Remus: the Misadventures of Brer Rabbit, Brer Fox, Brer Wolf, the Doodang, and Other Creatures.
 A retelling of the classic Afro-American tales relating the adventures and misadventures of Brer Rabbit and his friends and enemies.

Mabela the Clever
 An African folktale about a mouse who pays close attention to her surroundings and avoids being tricked by the cat.

The Old Woman who Lived in a Vinegar Bottle: a British Fairy Tale
 An ungrateful woman who complains constantly about her house is granted increasingly grandiose wishes by a fairy.

Mr. Semolina-Semolinus: a Greek Folktale
 Areti, a Greek princess, makes a man fit for her to love from almonds, sugar, and semolina, but when he is stolen away by a jealous queen, Areti searches the world for him.
